Dr. Levy has recently completed polling in partnership with major media partners including the New York Times Upshot, C-SPAN, Newsday, and Spectrum News. SCRI, under Dr. Levy's leadership, has consistently been graded as one of America's leading academic polling institutes by Nate Silver and 538.com.

Community Catalyst is a national consumer health advocacy organization. In her role as Director of the Women's Health Program,

Ms. Uttley is building upon more than 20 years of research, policy analysis and advocacy to protect access to timely, affordable women's health services from threats posed by consolidation in the health industry.

Her most recent publication, "Empowering New York Consumers in an Era of Hospital Consolidation" (May 2018), reported findings from a year-long study of New York's Certificate of Need (CON) program, funded by the New York State Health Foundation. The report recommended that state oversight of hospital consolidation should be more transparent and engaging of affected consumers and require hospitals to predict the impact of proposed mergers on the price of health care. A 2016 national study she co-authored, "When Hospitals Merge: Updating State Oversight to Protect Access to Care", identified best practices from among the 36 CON programs still in operation.

Ms. Uttley, who is based in Manhattan, is active in New York consumer health advocacy, serving on the steering committee of the statewide Health Care for All NY coalition. She has served as Vice President of the Education Fund of Family Planning Advocates of NYS (where she created the MergerWatch Project that she has directed for the last 20 years), Director of Public Affairs for the NYS Department of Health and as a journalist covering New York State government for the Albany Times Union. She has been President of the Public Health Association of NYC and Chair of the national Action Board of the American Public Health Association. She earned a master's in Public Affairs and Policy from the Nelson A. Rockefeller College of Public Affairs and Policy at the University at Albany and teaches in the master's degree in Health Advocacy Program at Sarah Lawrence College.

He is a graduate of the College of William & Mary and George Washington University law school.

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
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
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
